We live in a time of human history where we are generally safer and more comfortable than we've ever been, while simultaneously being more anxious than ever. Something doesn't add up! The Lord tells us, "Do not fear," more than He commands us to do anything else in His Word. What does that really mean? Are we breaking this command more than any other generation of people, or is there more to it than that? The goal of this class is to create a space for all of us to wrestle with this topic and begin a lifelong conversation about it. We will look at what the Lord, our culture, and our own bodies tell us about fear and anxiety. This class is a unique opportunity for adults and students to consider together a topic that is powerfully affecting both and begin to move toward it with a posture of hope instead of fear.

Friends,

Welcome! We are glad that you are here, and we trust that you will find a place at Trinity. As the new year and new decade begin, you may be making (or at least considering) resolutions to improve your lives. At the center of our most important resolutions is a search for purpose. We at Trinity wish to seek God's purpose in our shared life together.

In our fall series, we explored how God has written us into a cosmic drama, in which He seeks "to bring unity to all things in heaven and on earth under Christ" (Ephesians 1:10). And God truly means all things—every inch of the cosmos and every second of existence.

Throughout this series we will also interview congregants from various occupations, asking them to share ways in which their work reflects God's own work in the world. Together we will consider **Our Work, Our Faith, and the Mission of God**.

If you are new or visiting with us this morning, we want to welcome you to worship and let you know that we value your presence. We also want to invite you into the life of our church. We offer ministries for both children and students (grades 6-12) to get to know one another and our leaders more deeply, and grow in their knowledge and love of Jesus. Adult education classes take place at 10:00am, where men and women can explore various aspects of Christianity in a context of thoughtful teaching, discussion, and dialogue. We offer opportunities for community and care throughout the week through participation in our small groups. And there are further opportunities for connection and service through both periodic events and various ways to practically serve and love our neighbors and communities.
